Workshop 14: From Rhetoric to Reality: Local Ownership in Security Sector Reform

Abstract

The notion of local ownership has become highly visible as a central plank of security sector reform (SSR) good practice. While the argument that externally driven reform processes are unsustainable is now widely accepted, the principle of local ownership has proved difficult to both define and operationalise. Looking both at the concept and its application in, this panel subjects the broader issue of local ownership to critical scrutiny, furthers the debate on what local ownership is and why it matters, and explores how ownership issues have played out in different regional settings.
